Te Āpiti – Manawatū Gorge book wins local history award



Te Āpiti — Manawatū Gorge Te Au-rere-a-te-tonga, a History, a book commissioned by Te Āpiti — Manawatū Gorge Governance Group

and compiled by Michele Frey has been awarded the best local history publication by the Palmerston North Heritage Trust.

Ms Frey says she is honoured to receive the award, which is a recognition of contributions made by the wider Te Āpiti community.

"The book was an eight-year-long journey that introduced me to many people who were so open and willing to share their stories and connections with this truly unique and treasured place," says Ms Frey.

"It has been fantastic to capture narrative around the unique landform, past and present flora and fauna, its rich Māori and early European history and stories of some of the inhabitants, as well as the history of rail and the construction of the road, and different land use such as farming, wind farms and walking tracks.

"Complementing contributions from iwi, landowners, Horizons Regional Council, Palmerston North City Council, Department of Conservation, local historians, and community members are images from David Lupton and others which helps bring the book to life."

On behalf of Ms Frey, Te Āpiti – Manawatū Gorge Governance Group and Palmerston North Mayor Grant Smith and Horizons Regional Council's community biodiversity advisor Neil Mickleson accepted the Best Local History Book Award at a Palmerston North Heritage Trust function on Wednesday 10 November.

Mayor Smith says the book is a great reminder that there is so much more to

the area than the road.

"The book honours not only the natural environment but people who have called this special place home over the years, those who have contributed to its infrastructure, farmed the land, or enjoyed the reserve for recreational purposes," says Mayor Smith.

Many years of research and conversations have provided Michele with nuggets of information that she has carefully crafted into this fantastic publication.

"On behalf of the Gorge Governance Group we thank her for her collaborative approach and commitment to completing this important contribution to our region's history. The award is well deserved."

Not only has Te Āpiti – Manawatū Gorge Te Au-rere-a-te-tonga, a History been recognised for its authorship, \$12,000 profit from sales has been received by the Gorge Governance Group who are tasked with securing finances and putting in place appropriate systems to effectively resource and deliver work programmes to help grow biodiversity, recreational, educational and cultural values within the scenic reserve.

RECAP Update

Merry Kirihimete!

It's been another challenging year, so I'd like to keep this update light and let you know about some of the great things going on in our community for you to enjoy over the holiday period.

Firstly: a big thank you for all of your support with the rescued food distribution. I've had a number of our community (of all ages) help with pick-ups, loading into the library, organising and packing kai, and further offers of help with deliveries. So wonderful to have people here quick to lend practical help and support.

We have started pre packing bags while there has been Covid in the community, and will assess this week by week to see if it's needed/continues to work well. The last one for 2021 is on Wednesday December 22nd, and the first one for 2022 will be Wednesday January 12th. This is open to anyone and there is currently no criteria to receive a food parcel.

Over the summer we'd like to really encourage you to visit The Olsson Community Orchard and McCrae's Bush. We have a group of dedicated and hard working volunteers who have put in an amazing amount of mahi to restore and maintain this beautiful space. It's an excellent spot to picnic in and a lovely short, gentle bush walk suitable for younger children and those with limited mobility who would like to connect with nature. You can access both either the steps from the end of the Terrace, or from River Road (for those keen to avoid the steps!). In February the trees are full of fruit which is available for anyone to

pick and enjoy, just please leave some for others. A new sign has just been erected giving more details of the fruit trees.



I'd like to give a HUGE ngā mihi to Julie, Margi, Lance, Dianne and Peter in particular for their continued efforts as caretakers of this beautiful area, providing us with such a wonderful, valuable community resource and thriving green

The Community Garden next to the Ashhurst Library has had summer produce planted (there's a bit of celery there ready to be harvested right now). The plum and pears trees are looking like we will have another good year and we have a berm garden producing kai on North street (thanks to the participants of a recent workshop) that you are welcome to visit and pick from. Unfortunately we have decided to skip the December Crop Swap due to Covid-19, but keep checking the Sharing Shelf (next to the library) and the Seed Library (inside the library) as we will continue to put seasonal seedlings and seeds there.

Community Comment

Progress on earthworks associated with the Te Ahu a Turanga Highway over the hill is astounding. Only 10% of the work has been completed to date and much of that is for the access roads and sediment control. Work has also begun around the new roundabout to be developed in the vicinity of the Napier Rd/Fitzherbert East intersection. Check out progress on video footage from the regular drone flyover on the NZTA web pages for this project.

Residents will be surprised to hear that the City Council has approved the consent of a new pet crematorium on the edge of residential Ashhurst. With access from Mulgrave St, it will sit beside the stream to the rear of Kilmarnock Nurseries.

The consent process has been underway some time, with commissioner hearings held in October 2021 and the planning process stretching out over 18 months. The consent application had limited notification to the owners of the eight neighbouring properties, who all opposed the proposal.

Any challenge to the PNCC consent would be handled by the Environment However, Horizons Regional Court. Council is responsible for air quality and granting consent to discharge contaminants into the air. This consent is in its final stages of approval. There may be some challenges here as the technical assessment predicts any air pollutants would fall in an "area of pasture to the west of the site".

Owner Simone Morrison of Soul Friends Pet Cremations, has been involved with the pet cremation service for 12 years. It has been using the furnace facilities at Massey University, but this lease expires in 2022.

The site will be developed with a large shed to house up to four cremators, each associated with a 10.5 metre high chimney, and workshops, along with a chapel or quiet room and memorial garden for pet owners to grieve.

This is the time of the year to remind residents to help keep trees on street verges and in reserves alive in their formative years during dry conditions in the months ahead. Most of the trees are planted with novaflow pipes heading down around their roots, so it is an easy matter to pour a bucket of water down the hole and give them a drink when they look thirsty. Fruit and nut trees will reward their neighbourhood in the future once they are established and producing. Just visit the Olsson Orchard beside McCrae's Bush in coming months and have a taste of the bounty as it ripens on the trees.

The bittersweet moment has come for us at Hiwinui School to farewell our beloved Principal, Brenda Leigh.

After 46 years working in the NZ education system, with the last 20 of those leading Hiwinui School, Brenda is taking her well-deserved retirement.

Brenda started out as a Wellington Teachers College graduate in 1974. She had a wide and varied teaching history, including roles within new entrants classes, as a music and technical teacher (cooking and sewing) and directly prior to Hiwinui, spending 17 years at Pahiatua School, most of these as their Deputy Principal.

Brenda was delighted to accept the position of Principal, Hiwinui School where she was welcomed with open arms.

Already with ties to the area (Brenda's great-grandfather and his siblings had farmed in this area), it was meant to be.

When Brenda arrived at Hiwinui School in 2001, there were 47 students, three classrooms, an office, a resource room and a tiny library. Fast forward 20 years, and Hiwinui School is a thriving school with 151 students, six classrooms, a large library and a beautiful Open Learning Environment. All school buildings have either been completely refurbished or built. Under Brenda's watch, the school purchased 'Lot 9' Melford Lane in 2011, doubling the school's footprint and providing much needed playground space. In her time, Brenda has been a living testament to the school's motto of 'Seeds planted today will flourish and blossom tomorrow'.

However Brenda's contribution to Hiwinui School and the community simply can not be summed up with facts and figures. Brenda has left Hiwinui with so much more. She has instilled the school values of Respect and Honesty for Self, Others and the Environment, and lives them every day.

Current Board of Trustees Chairperson, Duncan Baker says of Brenda, "We are fortunate and forever grateful to have had such a professional and passionate leader who has been instrumental to the growth and identity of our school today. We can never thank Brenda enough for her



It's hugely disappointing that the Village Christmas parade and market had to be cancelled this year, and I want to acknowledge the Christmas parade team who had to make this difficult decision.

We are a resilient, creative and close-knit community who will get over this setback and go on to make the most of the summer months.

You can help summer shine and keep our community protected by making sure With the return of Anzac Day you and your whanau are double vaxxed, and I commend Ashhurst residents on the high level of vaccination uptake that's been reported.

At time of writing, Palmy's pre-Christmas and New Year celebrations are continuing as free ticketed events at CET Arena and Regent on Broadway, with details and updates on Council's Facebook page.

2021 in review

I wrote my first Village Voice column as Deputy Mayor in the December edition a year ago, and despite the interruptions and restrictions, a great deal has been achieved in those 12 months.

The biggest impact on Village life has been commencement of the He Ahu a Turanga: Manawatū Tararua Highway project as it spans the mouth of the Manawatū Gorge and sculpts the hillsides Ashhurst Community Library is planning a above Ashhurst.

In March this year, highway earthworks uncovered moa bones.

In May the Visitor Centre at the Waka Kotahi/NZ Transport Agency Napier Rd project office opened.

It's well worth a look to grasp the mammoth scale of the works and keep tabs on progress, with public access from 10am – 4pm during the week, making it an addition to the summer 'things to do in Ashhurst' list.

Ashhurst has been also identified as an area for city residential growth, with four local sites tagged for development, and proposed changes to the district plan notified.

Council work

During the year, Council worked alongside Waka Kotahi and the Ashhurst community steering group to identify

layout issues with roading and follow up on related ideas.

Roading upgrades included improvements to the main Village entrance at the intersection of Napier Rd and Cambridge Ave, while street pavements, traffic calming work and landscaping continued.

There is a real commitment from Council to maintain, improve and develop Village infrastructure, facilities and assets, with further work on the Village Valley Centre - including a new roof - being carried out over summer.

Even with central government's Three Waters reforms pending, Council is proceeding with the upgrade and integration of Ashhurst into Palmy's existing networks for fresh, waste and storm water.

commemorations, it was a real privilege for me to speak at this year's civic service in front of the Village Green cenotaph.

Let's hope this community tradition of 'meeting to remember' is able to continue next year.


