Community Comment

Our rates contributions to the City Council are returning in obvious ways to Ashhurst at present. Reroofing of the Village Valley Centre is well on its way to completion. This is part of the regular maintenance required of community centres and follows the interior painting and kitchen overhaul in recent years.

Additional footpath construction in North St completes the circuit around this block east of Cambridge Ave. What was mostly grassed paddocks only a few years ago is now a fully developed residential neighbourhood. Council gardeners have also been tidying up in and around the Village Green and our CBD as befitting the attention in the area during ANZAC Day services.

Repairs to Cambridge Ave between the railway overbridge and the roundabout will create some traffic congestion in the first weeks of May. The heavy traffic associated with the SH3 diversion has taken its toll on this street. Most of Ashhurst streets are based on graded metal roads drawn from our gravel pit beside the Red Cross shop. It is no surprise that the road is collapsing from the combined effects of higher traffic volumes and significantly increased vehicle weights. The cost of these repairs is funded by Waka Kotahi's state highway coffers rather than our rates.

A selection of residents has received an update on timelines for proposed changes

to the District Plan regarding future residential growth areas for Ashhurst. There is pressure to expand residential zones and intensify housing across the city to meet demand. The proposed areas in Ashhurst to rezone to residential status are at Mulgrave St (opposite Durham St), North St (West), the Pit area, and Winchester St (between existing houses and the stream).

The pre-consultation phase (2019-2021) informed immediate neighbours of a meeting where the proposed zone changes were identified. Feedback has been mixed, and while there was support for more housing, there was concern about its effects on Ashhurst. While the 'village character' of Ashhurst has been recognised in some Council documentation, it is not protected in its District Plan. Other concerns identified existing pressure on local schools, along with the increased load on infrastructure associated with more sections and increased population growth. The risk of another flood event as experienced in 2004 was discounted with the claim that these problems had been addressed by flood protection work completed under the Ashhurst West drainage scheme.

Due to staff shortages and recruitment delays, the formal rezoning process is not expected to be lodged until mid to late 2022, with hearings in 2023.

How to access a Rapid Antigen Test (RATs)?

The information below highlights how to easily access RATs kits either over the telephone, or online and encourages our older people to ask for help from friends or whanau if they are struggling to preorder their RATs kits.

If you have symptoms of COVID-19, or you live with someone who has COVID-19, you can pre-order a free Rapid Antigen Testing (RATs) kit to test yourself for COVID-19 easily at home.

Pre-ordering your free Rapid Antigen Testing kit is easy and can be done either:

- Over the phone, call 0800 222-478 and choose option 3
- · Online, via the Rapid Antigen Testing Requester website at www.requestrats. covid19.health.nz

To make a request through the website, you will need to have access to a mobile phone to validate the order. Requesting Rapid Antigen Testing on the requester site is an easy step-by-step process; just follow the instructions on screen.

Alternatively, you can ask a family member or friend to pre-order Rapid Antigen Tests on your behalf online using the RAT Requester website.

Once your order is complete, you will be issued an order number. You can then pick up your Rapid Antigen Testing kit from a collection site near you or have someone else collect your order for you - make sure they have your order number.

Speed safety on SH3 - Napier Rd

Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency is seeking feedback from people on proposed new safer speed limits designed to save lives and prevent serious injuries.

A reduced speed limit down to 60 kph is proposed for the stretch of SH3 beside Whakarongo School and inside the Ashhurst boundaries. No suggested changes for Stoney Creek Rd to Hacketts Rd, but the remainder is likely to be reduced to 80 kph.

RECAP Update

Kia ora. A quick update on all things RECAP.

Berm Gardening/Beginner's Workshop May 2022

We ran this workshop in the spring of 2021 and we're back for a hands-on opportunity where you will learn how to create raised beds and prepare existing beds for the winter growing season. We've had a high volume of requests for beginner gardening workshops, so this is for those just starting out, with additional info on best practice berm gardening (now allowed without permission from the Palmerston North City Council).

Facilitated by Beth Lew of Growing Gardens and Communities - Manawatū and Suzanne Chelius from RECAP/Palmerston North City Council's Sustainable Living Programme, we'll be covering: general site analysis, the benefits of a no-dig garden bed/raised bed, soil health/building soil, seasonal planting/companion planting and more as well as providing some easy grow seeds to take home to start your own māra kai (food garden).

Crop Swap and Drop-in Session with Phil Stevens of Slow Farm

Our second Crop Swap for 2022 is on Saturday, May 28th, 11.00am—1.00pm inside the Ashhurst Community Library. All are welcome and everything is free. Bring any excess produce, seeds, seedlings or gardening supplies. You do not need to give in order to take and vice versa. No registration is needed for this event.

We will be joined once again by local permaculture expert Phil Stevens offering free expert advice and guidance. This is an excellent opportunity on the cusp on winter to learn tips about how to keep your home warm and dry over the colder months, keep your garden growing and trees healthy during winter. You can bring any questions you may have for Phil on energy conservation, warm/dry tips, passive solar, solar electric, how to cut your household emissions with simple tweaks, gardening, water harvesting, fruit trees and perennial edibles, designing sections for resilience, soil health and more.

Ashhurst School Working Bee

We have a working bee in the Ashhurst School māra kai (food garden) during the school holidays to get the beds ready for the return of the school Gardening Club in Term 2. We will be meeting there on Tuesday, 26th April at 10.00am. No need

Masks are not required, but strongly encouraged, not only for COVID-19, but we will be using compost which can contain harmful bacteria when inhaled. Kids are more than welcome (but with a parent or caregiver, please).

Book Review: Grape Expectations

A book telling of one family's vision to create Manawatū's only vineyard (to date!) has been published.

Fiona McMorran was one of the coowners of Pohangina Valley Estate and is the author. The vineyard has closed now but Fiona and her sister Bronwyn still live on the property on which the vineyard was established. Fiona has retired from full time employment and now she has the time, she has written a history about the establishment of the vineyard. She started writing the history just for the family initially but was encouraged to get it published.



Ashhurst Athletics Club Ends Season

Police Update

I would like to address a recent spate of vehicle crime over the last few months in Ashhurst and the wider Manawatu area.

Recently I spoke to the Sergeant of the Tactical Crime Unit regarding these crimes and he provided the information below.

Since the beginning of 2022, approximately 350 vehicles, as well as a number of trailers, have been stolen in the wider Manawatu area. Ashhurst has not been exempt from this type of crime.

We believe a number of these thefts can be attributed to a comparatively small number of offenders. Since the start of the year, six offenders have been positively identified as collectively committing over 80 vehicle offences in the region.

Police are committed to actively investigating vehicle theft and holding offenders to account. However, Police cannot be everywhere at once and cannot deter opportunistic thieves on their own.

Detective Sergeant Carl Newton says "While the vast majority of stolen cars are recovered by Police, they are often damaged, and the theft of a vehicle is not

only disruptive but upsetting for many people. Ensuring your vehicle is secure will cost you nothing and can help to avoid the distress and cost associated with car theft."

We urge people to take simple steps in order to prevent their car from being stolen in the first place. Taking measures such as ensuring that when your car is unattended, it is locked and all valuable items are removed or concealed from view is important.

If possible, park your vehicle in a garage. If it must be parked on the road, try to park in a well-lit, busy area. There are also anti-theft devices that are available for trailers that will help prevent theft. By making your vehicle more challenging to steal, opportunistic thieves will be more likely to leave it alone.

If you notice suspicious activity around cars, please contact Police on 111 if it is happening, or 105 after the fact.

We would also like to thank the local community for their continued support and vigilance in reporting anything out of the ordinary.



Te Ahu a Turanga: Manawatū Tararua Highway Community update

Steady progress continues to be made on the construction of the Te Ahu a Turanga: Manawatū Tararua Highway.

To date, more than 2.4 million cubic metres of earth has been moved across the entire project site. The project's total amount of earthworks is about 6 million cubic metres, and the team is on track to move half of this by the end of 2022.

Considerable progress has also been made across the structures along the alignment. Of the minor structures, Bridge 10 is structurally complete, and Bridge 1 is nearing completion. Piling work is well under way on the Parahaki Bridge across the Manawatuū River, and the main causeway on the Eco Bridge Viaduct is also nearly finished.

More than 250,000 native plants have been planted by landscaping teams so far as part of the project's ecological offset programme. A further 573,000 natives are expected to be planted this year. In total, almost 2 million native plants will be sowed throughout the wider region and along the alignment during the project.

From an employment perspective, Te Ahu a Turanga is contributing to the local economy, with between 250 and 350 people, including subcontractors, employed on the project at any one time. Currently, 80 per cent of these staff live locally and 35 per cent of these are of Māori or Pasfika descent.

Like all large construction projects in New Zealand, Te Ahu a Turanga has been affected by the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. Since the emergence of the Omicron variant, there have been significant increases in absenteeism on the project, as workers have been required to

isolate due to positive tests or being close household contacts to positive cases. The impact extends beyond direct project employees, with subcontractors and workers employed in the extended supply chain also impacted.

Additionally, the COVID-19 pandemic has slowed the delivery of key construction materials due to the disruption of overseas supply chains affecting the delivery of materials.

Unexpected wet weather conditions and storm events during the traditionally drier period between December 2021 and March 2022 have also hampered the project's progress. The earthworks teams have made considerable progress when work has been possible, recording a record day of 24,000 cubic metres in one day, but the wet weather has inevitably caused delays. To mitigate these delays, winter works consents have been lodged with the Regional Council to allow us to continue with earthworks during the winter months.

In other project news, preliminary scientific analysis of the moa bones discovered by the Te Ahu a Turanga: Manawatū Tararua Highway team in the Ruahine Range in March 2021 has found they may be between 180,000 and 345,000 years old. Further results are expected later this year.

The current completion date for the highway remains December 2024.
