Community Comment

This long, wet winter seems to be fading away at last, with glimmers of warmer temperatures helping to dry out the waterlogged ground. The birds and bees are enjoying a feed of nectar from the many blossoms appearing in our streets and gardens. Winchester Street's cherry trees are a treat at present and kowhai elsewhere are attracting their share of attention from tui. The Olsson Orchard next to McCrae's Bush provides a sequence of fruit blossom, kowhai and birdsong at present, as it prepares to share its produce with the community in the summer.

The dry weather has also improved options for successful repair of potholes in our streets. Footpath renewals are now complete in North and Worcester Streets. A serious water main leak under the roundabout was of some concern but was quickly fixed.

Local body elections are in full swing at present. Make sure to get your votes returned before the deadline of midday 8th October.

A couple of events of note in the past month have been held. The new Ashhurst Health Centre has been able to open its newly renovated facility opposite the school at long last after the challenges and delays of sourcing building materials. The return of a medical practice in Ashhurst will be warmly welcomed by the community.

Key dignitaries were in attendance for the release of the Te Apiti Manawatu Gorge Masterplan. The Minister of Conservation, Poto Williams, unveiled a new sign at the carpark overlooking the new bridge construction before the group assembled at the Ashhurst Domain for official speeches and conversation in a warmer climate. The City's Mayor and Minister of Parliament were present, along with key people from local iwi, Horizons Regional Council, Department of Conservation, three Councils, and other volunteer groups involved in the development of this masterplan.

The new road Te Ahu a Turanga, and its new bridges will provide access to a proposed loop walkway linking Ashhurst to Te Apiti via the Saddle Rd and a Manawatu bridge clip on. Approved access to the old Gorge highway as a shared path is still under investigation. Other exciting options include expansion of mountain bike trails, new loop tracks and trails, a skybridge linking the two mountain ranges, UNESCO Geopark status, a tourism and accommodation hub and Rangitane projects. It should be stressed that many of these projects are aspirational proposals without funding at present. However, the new road, shared path and Manawatu bridge clip on have committed funding and a proposed opening of December 2024.

Local Artist Opens Studio for the Art Trail Manawatu

October in the Edible Garden

October is the month that everything starts booming. Potatoes can be planted. Traditionally, they are grown in trenches, but can successfully be grown in pots as well-great if you rent or have limited space.

Traditionally, tomatoes and other warm weather crops are planted on Labour Day. Nowadays, with climate change a factor-they can go in earlier but keep an eye on the weather in case there is a sneak frost. Smaller plants are of course easier to protect, although you can also hedge your bets by planting some out now, and some at the end of the month.

It's also a good time to think ahead to the dry period over summer when we may have water restrictions. I am planning to put in ollas, an old method of maximising water use and minimising evaporation. They are terracotta pots that are buried next to plants. You pour the water in, and the plant roots draw the water out of the pot through osmosis (terracotta is porous). The plants get the water they need, and there is the bonus of no water on the top of the soil-minimising the growth of weeds. You do, however, need to surface water until the plant roots are big enough to access the olla.

Also remember to plant flowers to encourage beneficial insects and predators that will protect your crops. One of the biggest problems for many is the Tomato/ Potato Psyllid-which attacks members of the Solanaceae family and also Kumera and Convolvulus (Bindweed). Most of us cannot afford to cover our plants to prevent this pest, so our best defence is natural predators and observationexamining your crops to prevent them getting a foothold. Pohangina Hall

Many years ago, in the days when horses were the main form of transport and cows were milked by hand, the original Pohangina Hall was built. Not very well, apparently, as it had to be rebuilt 36 years later. It was home to dances and celebrations, meetings and clubs. Halls like this sprang up all around the country, enriching the lives of the people in the local community.

As people move back to thinking "local", these halls are again becoming a feature. The Pohangina Hall has been reasonably quiet since the advent of Covid, but it has still been used for weddings, birthday parties and meetings. The quiz night last year was sold out and music sessions have recently started. However, to ensure the continued survival of this hall it needs to be used. If you are planning a celebration or a community event, consider the Pohangina Hall. It can hold up to 150 people, although the warm, woody interior makes it suitable for smaller groups too. The cost of hiring the hall is reasonable and we only ask that you leave it clean and tidy – ready for the next person.
